

ELIJAH Means: “My GOD is YAHWEH”

The name **Elijah** comes from the Hebrew אֱלִיָּהוּ (Eliyahu), composed of three elements: אֵל (El, “God”), the possessive suffix י (i, “my”), and יהו (Yahu, a form of the divine name YHWH), together meaning “My God is Yahweh”

ELIJAH Was a Prophet and a Warrior(Spiritual and Physical), he was a Chosen One – endowed by GOD with many spiritual gifts:

Elijah burst on the scene in 1 Kings 17: where he pronounced 3 years of drought upon the land of Israel under king Ahab's rule, because the king through cowardice and pride turned away from GOD, and built his wife Jezebel; altars to worship Baal whom led the entire nation of Israel into apostasy and rebellion against the One True GOD – YAHWEH.

1 Kings 17: 1 And Elijah the Tishbite, who was of the inhabitants of Gilead, said unto Ahab, “As the LORD God of Israel liveth, before whom I stand, there shall not be dew nor rain these years, but according to my word.”

Elijah - is known for his bold confrontation of idolatry, miraculous acts, and unwavering devotion to God

Key Moments in Mission and Scriptures

1. **Mount Carmel confrontation:** Elijah challenged 450 prophets of Baal, demonstrating God’s power when fire consumed his sacrifice, affirming that Yahweh alone is God **1 Kings 18:20-40**
2. **Miracles and divine provision:** He performed acts such as raising the dead, calling down fire from heaven, and being fed by ravens, symbolizing God’s supernatural provision **1 Kings 17: 2 - 8**
3. **Ascension to heaven:** At the conclusion of his path on earth: Elijah was taken up in a whirlwind with chariots of fire, making him one of only two figures in the Bible to enter heaven alive, alongside Enoch. **2 Kings 2: 1 -13**
4. **Prophesied a three(3) year drought upon the land:** Because of the idolatry of King Ahab and his wife queen Jezebel in turning the children of GOD unto idolatry **1 Kings 16: 29 – 34**

Symbolic Meaning

The name **Elijah** embodies **faith, courage, and divine intervention**. It represents a life of steadfast obedience to God, even in the face of opposition or danger. For believers, the name serves as a symbol of hope, spiritual strength, and the assurance of God’s presence in times of weakness or uncertainty.
